In addition, the AVP of Treatment will participate as a member of: Central Review Team (CRT), Research Committee, ABA Conference Committee, and Peer Review Teams.

Qualifications:

Doctoral or Masters Degree in Applied Behavior Analysis, Special Education, Psychology, or related field. Current Board Certification in Behavior Analysis (BCBA). Five (5) years experience implementing programs utilizing the principals of applied behavior analysis (ABA), professional ABA consultation, and/or training others in principals of applied behavior analysis and two (2) years' experience administering related human service functions is required.
