These responsibilities include the completion of behavioral assessments, short and long term behavioral consultations and direct treatment as assigned by the Senior Vice President of Consultation and or the Senior Vice President of Operations & Practice Development.

### **Qualifications:**

Doctoral or Master's Degree in Applied Behavior Analysis, Special Education, Psychology, or related field (at the discretion of the President, additional experience designing behavioral interventions may be substituted for degree requirements). Current Board Certification in Behavior Analysis (BCBA). A documented history of presentations in behavior analytic conferences, peer reviewed publications, and minimum of 3 years in applied settings developing and implementing behavioral interventions and teaching programs.
